IF YOU HAVEN'T BEEN TO THE NEW Hill Center, the only question is what on earth is holding you back? There's an abundance of incredible shopping, and among the myriad magnificent shops are two new—at least to Nashville—stores worth looking into.

Jigsaw was one of my favorite places to shop when I lived in London, and I'm absolutely thrilled it's here now. It's one of England's best-known fashion brands, and it's on its way to capturing American hearts as well. The key to Jigsaw is its irreverent

take on contemporary fashion—it's stylish, but not so trendy it'll be out before it really had a chance to take off. It's also sophisticated, meaning you have great material for a flexible wardrobe that goes everywhere.

The atmosphere in Jigsaw is relaxed. Designed to blur the lines between design studio and shopping experience, it's a whimsical space with vintage and unfinished furniture, unpainted walls and whitewashed floors. No Jigsaw store is exactly like any other, so the Nashville store is ours and ours alone. Carrying both misses and juniors sizes, Jigsaw has clothes for just about every girl wanting to stand out in a crowd.

Meanwhile, **H. Audrey** is straight from the imagination of Holly Williams, who happened to be on our 2007 Best Dressed list. She's also the granddaughter of country music legend Hank Williams and a singer and songwriter in her own right. We love this store—it's a gorgeous space with a hint of Gilded Age influence in interior design, and it's filled with designer brands worth having. And, of course, Williams

selects all the clothes she sells herself. "I'm carrying the designers I missed having in Nashville that I love," she told us at the photo shoot for Best Dressed.

She's aiming for a wide assortment of merchandise, matching the demographic that falls between the low end and the high, so there's something for everyone. Makes sense coming from a girl who once told me she wore what she liked—sometimes she felt very Zac Posen and sometimes like a Hanes T-shirt. At H.Audrey, you'll find lines like Alexander McQueen, Daryl K. and, yes, Hanes.
